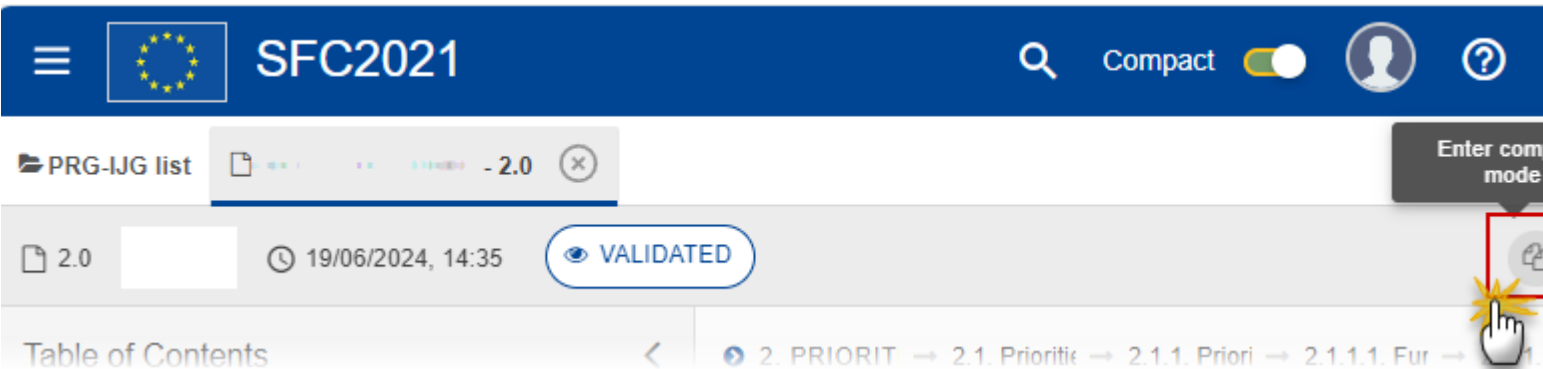


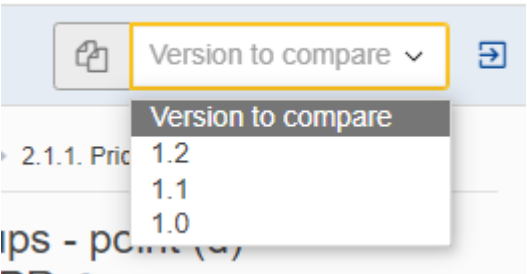
General - Is it possible to compare two versions of an object?

COMPARE is currently available for a limited number of objects.

To compare 2 versions, enter one of the versions you wish to compare and click on the compare icon on the top right-hand side of the screen:



Select the version you wish to compare it with:

The lion (*Panthera leo*) is a large cat of the genus *Panthera*, native to Africa and India. It has a muscular, broad-chested body; short, rounded ears; and a hairy tuft at the end of its tail. It is sexually dimorphic; males have a prominent mane. It is a social species, forming prides. A pride consists of a few adult males, related females, and cubs. Groups live together, preying mostly on large ungulates. The lion is an apex predator, but some lions scavenge when opportunities occur and have been known to do not actively seek out and prey on humans.

The lion inhabits grasslands, savannahs, and shrublands. It is usually active during the day, but when persecuted, it adapts to being active at night and at dawn. During the Neolithic period, the lion ranged throughout Africa and Eurasia.

You can tell when you are in compare mode when the orange icons are visible in the Table of Contents:

! Note that you cannot edit or navigate away from the object when in compare mode.
