Disclaimer: *This document has been prepared by the Commission services for their internal use; as such, its content cannot be considered guidance to the Member States or to any other parties (e.g. for the purpose of drafting national CAP Strategic Plans). The aim of this document is to outline the technical data structure (Technical Guidelines) that will be used in SFC2021 for the structured exchange of information between Member States and DG AGRI in relation to the submission of the CAP Strategic Plan. The document was last updated to align with the secondary legislation on the CAP Plan content and to enhance, where necessary, hints and instructions for encoding. It has to be taken into account that visually, the pattern for entering data in this SFC application might differ from the way elements are displayed here. In case any Member State desires to provide written comments and feedback on the working version 8, those could be sent in summary to AGRI-CI@ec.europa.eu. For feedback on the functionalities of the SFC2021 tool already in production, Member States can send comments to EC-SFC2021-INFO@ec.europa.eu.*

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0 INTRODUCTION

0.1 Purpose of this document

The aim of this document is to outline the technical data structure (aka: Technical Guidelines) that will be used in SFC2021 for the structured exchange of information between Member States and the European Commission in relation to the CAP Strategic Plan. It is a living document and it is subject to changes, based on the needs for clarification and the development of new features. It should not serve as interpretation of the legal base.

The objective of the document is to provide additional technical information required to design the CAP Strategic Plan IT module in SFC. The Technical Guidelines are also useful for the Member State to consider in preparation of the encoding of their CAP Strategic Plan in SFC. It contains additional information orienting the users of links in between the sections. The entry of information is not always linear. The entries in some sections are automatically retrieved in others. The users could mention and provide also cross-references if content was detailed by them in different parts of the module.

These technical guidelines are one outcome of the IT Working Group involving key business units for the different chapters of the CAP Strategic Plan draft template.

These technical guidelines give additional indications on:

- The type of information required: text; amounts; number...;
- How they will be encoded in SFC: textbox, list, structured table...;
- Whether information is mandatory or optional;
- Whether information is encoded by the Member State or prefilled by SFC or other systems (i.e. Eurostat);
- Cardinalities (i.e. one or many interventions by type of intervention);
- Technical dependencies between sections (i.e. Targets defined in chapter 2 will be used in chapter 6).

0.2 Scope of this document

This document is limited to the definition of the technical data structure of the CAP Strategic Plan for the period 2023-2027.

0.3 Intended audience

- DG AGRI Business units involved in the definition of the CAP Strategic Plan
- DG AGRI IT Unit (R.3)
- Member State representatives responsible for the entry of information through the application

0.4 Important remarks

0.4.1 Structured approach

- Electronic forms embedded in the system (structured data);
- Data defined as structured cannot be replaced by non-structured data;
- Content of references / hyper-links are not considered as transferred to the Commission;
- Structured data prevails in case of inconsistency with non-structured data.

0.4.2 Limitation for the number of characters

- A **technical limitation** of 70 000 characters (+/- 20 pages) is defined for each of the **rich textual fields** ('Summary of the SWOT Analysis',...)..
- For each of these textual fields that are close to this technical limit, SFC2021 will display a "warning". Text exceeding the technical limit will not be accepted by SFC2021 (application and web-services)
- **One exception** is for the 'Strategic Statement' rich text field that will be limited to 9 000 characters.
- **Specific characters limits** are also defined for the code, title, description , etc...of elements added by the Member State user ('Need', 'Intervention', etc...)

0.4.3 Text formatting and files extensions of additional electronic documents

- **Limited text formatting options** (bold-italic-underline/font size/lists/tables). In case of copy/paste from Microsoft Word, text format will be sanitized.
- Not all **files extensions for the annexes** are valid. For an optimal conversion and synchronisation with the applications used by the European Commission, additional documents will be sent with the format extensions .docx, .xlsx and/or .pdf.

0.4.4 Annexed documents to the CAP Strategic Plan

All annexes always need to be attached, to any version of the CSP, from the section "General / Documents". If documents change, the new version of the document(s) needs to be uploaded. If annexed documents don't change, they can be copy-pasted from the previous version using the button 'Import documents from previous version', available in SFC2021 for this purpose.

0.4.5 Upload of figures (illustration)

- For each rich textual field, **one or several figures** can be uploaded;
- Formats allowed are:
 - JPEG for photographic images;
 - PNG for everything else.
- All figures referring to a textual field can be displayed within the text;
- The size of the figures must be lower than 2Mb and lower than 1772 x 2362 pixels (15 x 10 cm in 300 dpi).
- The total amount size of the figures must be lower than 30 Mb by CAP Strategic Plan version
- The Member State should verify that the images are correctly rendered in the pdf/Word report generated by SFC

There is no limit as to the number of corrections a Member State can make under Article 119(12) of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115. The correction of the errors is made in the last version of the CAP Strategic Plan approved by the Commission.

The Commission does not approve the corrections of clerical or obvious errors or corrections of purely editorial nature that do not affect the implementation of the policy and the intervention. The letter acknowledging the information about the correction will be sent to the Member State via SFC2021.

The following sections are required only if the option ‘Amendment’ is selected, and they will not be displayed or enabled if the option ‘Corrections’ is selected.

Changes that lead to the creation of budget codes (i.e. creation of an extra Planned Unit Amount, a change in the payment reduction tranches or 100% capping practice for the Basic income support for sustainability, creation of an extra “article” defining the contribution rate for rural development interventions) cannot be made through a correction, and they need to be included in a request for amendment of the CAP Strategic Plan.

1.2.5 Notification by Member States of modifications to elements of the CAP Strategic Plan under Article 119(9) of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115

According to Article 119(9) of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115, Member States may make and apply at any time changes to elements related to interventions for rural development in their CAP Strategic Plans, including the eligibility conditions for such interventions. Such modifications do not lead to changes in targets and/or milestones.

Modifications of the CAP Strategic Plans relating to interventions for rural development leading to changes in targets and/or milestones need to be submitted to the Commission in a request for amendment and be approved by the Commission before they take effect.

In line with Article 2(6) of Delegated Regulation (EU) 2023/370, the Member State should notify DG AGRI of those changes via SFC2021, the official channel of communication between the Member States and the Commission. Such changes should be notified to the Commission by the time the Member States start applying them, paying particular attention to explain in detail in the notification, for each change, why the concrete targets/milestones related to that intervention are not affected (a generic statement will not be considered to constitute a sufficient justification).

All the information about the notified changes needs to be encoded in SFC2021 by the time the notification is sent, and in any case ahead of the submission of the next request for amendment of the CAP Strategic Plan.

The notification needs to contain: (i) the subject of the changes; (ii) justification confirming that the change does not affect the targets referred to in Article 109(1), point (a), of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115; and (iii) the date of the entry into effect of the change in the Member State.

According to Article 86(3) of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115, expenditure related to modifications which fall within the scope of Article 119(9) of that Regulation would be eligible as from the date of the notification of those modifications.

1.2.6 Review of the CAP Strategic Plans by Member States under Article 120 of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115

Article 120 of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115 provides that when an amendment is made to any of the legislative acts listed in Annex XIII of that Regulation, each Member State needs to assess whether its CAP Strategic Plan should be amended accordingly, in particular the explanation referred to in Article 109(2), point (a)(v) of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115 (environmental and climate architecture) and the further elements of the CAP Strategic Plan referred to in that explanation. Each Member State must, within six months after the deadline of transposition of the amendment, in the case of a Directive listed in Annex XIII of the mentioned Regulation or after the date of application of the amendment in the case of a Regulation listed in Annex XIII¹ of the mentioned Regulation, notify the Commission via SFC2021 of the outcome of its assessment with an accompanying explanation and, if necessary, also within those six months submit a request to amend its CAP Strategic Plan in accordance with Article 119(2) of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115.

The notification should be sent by the Member State to the Commission at the same time as the request for amendment. The request for amendment containing modifications of the CAP Strategic Plan resulting from the assessment referred to in Article 120 of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115 will have to be submitted within the six-month period referred to above (the assessment and approval process with respect to such request may be concluded at a later stage). To help Member States to structure the information to be provided under Article 120 of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115, a template of a notification is annexed to the SFC2021 Technical Guidelines.

According to Article 119(7), second subparagraph, of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115, such a request for amendment will not count for the maximum number of requests for amendment in the year of its submission. Member States will need to indicate this by using the relevant tickbox for the type of amendments in SFC2021.

¹ The assessment – and, where relevant, the request for amendment – may cover amendments to several legislative acts listed in Annex XIII of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115.

2.3.2. Planned interventions and outputs with a direct and significant link to result indicators

This summary will be built based on information encoded in other parts of the tool.

For each Result Indicator, retrieved information from Section 5 on an aggregated level will be displayed related to:

- *What interventions are planned to contribute to the achievement of the target value*
- *Which output indicators and planned outputs have been attributed (if available based on the level of planning applied by the Member State) to the specific result indicator and output (on intervention or on unit amount level)*
- *Member States establish in Section 5 the link between interventions and result indicators, when there is a direct and significant link. In this summarized table, Member States can see the summary of planned outputs linked to each result indicator for consistency check. Outputs in Section 5 can be planned per intervention or per Unit amounts or per groups of Unit amounts. RI can be attributed to Unit amounts (not necessarily a whole intervention). The table retrieves information from the different levels. The information under target/planned outputs can be displayed in table 2.3.2 either as the sum of outputs for the planned unit amount or the maximum value amongst the outputs for said planned unit amount over the years as relevant for the Result Indicator. For area based result indicators, the sum of planned outputs should always be equal to or higher than the numerator of the result indicator, in order to avoid double counting of outputs – please check before validation in data where information is retrieved from. In an explanatory box related to this table, Member States will be able to explain potential large gaps between this sum and the numerator. When the unit of planned outputs differ from the unit of result indicators, the sum of planned outputs will not be calculated and the table will only serve for consistency checks and to visualise the established links.*

As regards the EAFRD Environmental and climate ring-fencing and the rebate for eco-schemes, those should be reported as follows in SFC:

- Link to Specific Objectives (SOs)
 - In line with the provisions of Article 93 of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115:
 - All interventions under **Article 70** of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115 should be linked to at least one of the SOs referred to in Article 6(1), points (d), (e), (f) or (i) of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115 as regards animal welfare as by virtue of Article 70 such interventions are inherently linked to those specific objectives.
 - All interventions under **Article 72** of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115 should be linked to at least one of the SOs referred to in Article 6(1), points (d), (e) or (f) of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115 as by virtue of Article 72 SPR such interventions are inherently linked to those specific objectives.
 - Interventions under **Articles 73 and 74** of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115 Member States consider to count for the environmental and climate ring-fencing should be linked to at least one of the SOs referred to in Article 6(1), points (d), (e), (f) or (i) of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115 as regards animal welfare.
 - ANC payments (**Article 71 of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115**) contribute partially (50%) to the ENV ring-fencing. The objective of ANC payments – besides income support – is to limit land abandonment, which might contribute to preserving farmland biodiversity, thus the link to the SO referred to in Article 6(1), point (f) of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115 would be the most logic attribution. Scientific literature⁹, coincides in signalling such effects, if any, on mountain pastures. Therefore, Member States are recommended to link ANC payments to both SOs referred to in Article 6(1), points (a) and (f) of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115.

- Link to ENV ring-fencing
 - All interventions under Articles 70, 71¹⁰ and 72 of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115 will automatically be considered as contributing to the ENV ring-fencing.

- On the contrary, for Articles 73 and 74 of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115, only expenditure for interventions which have as associated SO at least one of the SOs referred to in Article 6(1), points (d), (e), (f) or (i) of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115 as regards animal welfare and which are flagged as contributing to the ENV ring-fencing in section 5.3 will be taken into account in the calculation of this ring-fencing. Pursuant to Point 5(a)(iv) of Annex I to Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2021/2289, only those interventions may be considered for the ring-fencing where the whole intervention fully contributes to the environment and climate specific objectives or animal welfare.
- Rebate for eco-schemes

For determining the amount available for the rebate referred to in Article 97(2)-(4), the following interventions will be taken into account:

- All interventions under Articles 70 and 72
- Interventions under Articles 73 and 74 which are considered eligible for the ENV ring-fencing.

The obligation will remain for Member States to encode the rebate amount they intend to use in the overview table.

While this overview table is not meant to reflect the implementation, but only the planning, it will serve as a basis to calculate the so called reverse ceilings, as detailed in Articles 92, 93, 95, 96, 97 and 98. This will be used by the Commission for the financial management of the EAGF and EAFRD.

These “reverse ceilings” are the amounts available for spending for expenditure other than the ones subject to ring-fencing.

While those are minimum spending requirements, Member States are free to reserve higher amounts than those minimums, if they so wish, as long as they comply with the provisions set out in Articles 92, 93, 95, 96, 97 and 98 of Regulation (EU) 2021/2115. Reverse ceilings will always be calculated based on the minimum spending requirements. However, an exception applies in case Member States both fulfil the conditions and decide to compensate under-execution of eco-schemes with EAFRD amounts reserved for environmental- and climate-related objectives. In this specific case, the reverse ceilings for the relevant Articles 70, 72 and 73 interventions will be increased by the amount needed to compensate under-execution of eco-schemes.

Those “reverse ceilings” will be calculated for the respect of ring-fencing for LEADER, environmental and climate, young farmers, eco-schemes and complementary redistributive income, as shown below.

They will be adapted, where relevant, upon requests for amendments of the CAP Strategic Plan submitted by the Member States.
